Communism in America, its beginnings, growth and gradual decline from a wartime peak of influence to the final shattering of the "faith" in 1955, are covered in this lively chronicle.

by Joseph Paul-Boncour. Speller. 269 pp. \$6.00.  
A former statesman writes intimately of the period from the 1880's to the end of World War I, when French politics was dominated by such figures as Waldeck-Rousseau, Jaures, and Clemenceau.
